第3問 ※解答例（解答は複数あり）

【解答例1】

I do not believe that young people should be required to vote or pay a penalty, even though only 43% of 18- and 19-year-olds voted in the 2024 election. I have three reasons for this.

First, low voter turnout is not only a problem among young people. Many age groups do not vote as much as they should. If young people must pay a penalty, then everyone else should as well.

Second, one reason for low turnout may be that few politicians focus on issues that matter to young people. Forcing them to vote ignores the possibility that no candidate appeals to them.

Finally, although encouraging young people to be interested in politics is important, punishing them financially is not a good solution. Many people at this age are financially unstable and may face barriers such as school, work, or transportation. Instead, rewarding people for voting might be a more effective approach.

For these reasons, I believe it is not a good idea to make young people pay a fine for not voting.

【解答例2】

I believe that young people should vote or pay a penalty, even though only 43% of 18- and 19-year-olds voted in the 2024 election. I have three reasons for thinking this.

First, voting is an important responsibility in a democracy. If people do not vote, their voices are not heard. Young people are part of society, so they should also take responsibility and join elections.

Second, if young people do not like politicians, voting is still important. They can choose the best option, even if it is not perfect. If they do not vote, politicians will not try to understand young people's needs.

Finally, a small penalty can help increase participation. It may encourage young people to think more about politics and take action. This can help create better habits for the future.

These are the three reasons why I believe young people should vote or pay a penalty if they do not vote.
